Must be able to warp a loom

Materials Fee: \$15

Materials supplied in session:

- A color spiral bound instruction booklet, illustrated with diagrams and pictures.

- Warp should measure a minimum of 8 inches weaving width on the loom and a minimum of 2 yards
- Thread warp for plain weave
- Sett appropriate for weft faced plain weave
- Weft is the same yarn as used for warp
- Stick shuttles and/or a boat shuttle with bobbin
- Scissors
- Tapestry needle
- Pencil and paper to take notes
- Anything else that helps you with your weaving such as reader glasses and a small light

2W-R023: Twinning with a Twist: 2 and 3 Color Taniko

No prerequisite experience required

2W-W003: Wear your Weaving: Sew a Simple Jacket with Handwoven Fabric

Must be able to operate a sewing machine

Materials Fee: \$0

Sewing Machine

Student Supply List (what you need to bring!):

- Sewing machine + extension cord
- Two sewing threads: One in a color that contrasts with your fabric and one that matches
- Quilting clips and/or sewing pins
- Fabric scissors & Measuring tape
- Chalk or Frixion marker for marking fabric
- French curve (optional)
- Handwoven fabric yardage of any style (see below)

Things to keep in mind when weaving or selecting a fabric for this project:

- Bring a minimum of 5.5 yards (5 meters) of finished fabric length. This jacket pattern is designed to fit any body type and the exact measurements of your jacket will custom-designed based on your body measurements. 5.5 yards is enough fabric to create a jacket in both straight and plus sizes, and any extra fabric can be used for an extra oversized fit, longer sleeves, peplums, pockets, or other features, if desired.
- Fabric width should be between 14-20 inches (35-50 cm) wide. Keep in mind that the width of your fabric determines the length of your jacket, so wider fabrics = longer jackets. The finished jacket length will be approximately 2x the fabric width. Hold your fabric width against your torso; the finished length will be about twice this. Pick your fabric width based on your personal preference. Do you like shorter or longer Jackets?
- This pattern works with fabrics in any material, but try to avoid fabrics that are super lightweight and very loosely woven or very heavy and extremely tightly-woven. Aim for the middle. We're striving for both style and comfort, so select a fabric that you'd actually be excited to wear!
- Fringe is highly encouraged! Feel free to twist, braid, leave it as long or short as desired, or remove it completely (all of which can also be done in class).
- If you're deciding between fabrics, bring a few options with you.
- **Make sure your fabric is washed and ironed before the workshop.**

- 3) You can use t-shirts with designs on them, but decide ahead of time whether you want the designed areas to be part of your rug, or if you will be cutting the designed areas out. With a large design, this can mean losing most of the shirt. Plan on bringing extra shirts if you think you will want to eliminate designs.
- 4) It is OK to use t-shirts with holes and stains. Sometimes they can be used instead of cut around!
- 5) Thrift shops often group their t-shirts by color, making it easy to choose a color scheme for your rug!

Making t-shirt yarn is messy! Wear comfortable, washable clothes. If you are sensitive to dust, you may wish to bring a mask. Please feel free to e-mail me with any questions prior to the workshop.

- Tie up two outer treadles for basket weave – 1&2, 3&4
- Weave a small header to check your threading and fix any mistakes.

Wefts

- 12/2 natural unmercerized cotton
- Fine white cotton rags – sheeting or soft cotton fabric is good, ½-1 yard or part of an old, soft cotton sheet



- 2/8 – 2/18 wool yarn or fine wool singles – choose colors that could be plant dyed for historic look.
- Wool boucle, cotton chenille and other textured yarns. Reds, blues, yellow, gold, beige, brown, black
- Optional – thicker cotton yarn and/or mop cotton

Any floor or table loom with at least 4 shafts of any weaving width as we will be making a sampler of mug rugs no wider than 4-6 inches.

- Set-up instructions: warp should be at least 1 yard and can be out of 3/2 cotton or cotton twine seine, or simple smooth string 39 ends totals
- Threading: 123432 (repeat 6 times = 36 ends) then balance with last thread on shaft 1 = 37 ends + 2 floating selvages = 39
- Sett: 6 ends per inch so warp should be 6" in the reed - use a 12-dent
- Reed and sley every other dent (if possible)
- Tie-up:
 - If you have a table loom you do not need to do any tie up.
 - If you are bringing a floor loom and want to tie it up ahead of time here is the tie-up:
 - treadle 1 - tie-up 2, 3, 4 (shaft 1 untied)
 - treadle 2 - tie-up 1, 3, 4 (shaft 2 untied)
 - treadle 3 - tie-up 1, 2, 4 (shaft 3 untied)
 - treadle 4 - tie-up 1, 2, 3 (shaft 4 untied)

In addition to a fully set up loom please bring:

- 3-4 shuttles and 6-10 bobbins
- Small scissors
- Tapestry needle for hem stitching
- Bobbin winder if you have one (we can share if we have 2 or 3)
- Pencil, eraser (I will provide graph paper)
- Colored pencils - we will use these for designing figures
- Yarns: Various wool yarns of different colors - bring at least 3-4 colors. You do not need large quantities because we are just making mug rugs. However, boundweave usually looks best if it is woven with yarn of consistent weight per pound. I typically use Harrisville Highland or Shetland.
